Internship Description

Imani Village/Imani Works! /Trinity UCC are seeking a motivated Social Justice/Political Science/ Sociology/ Economics /Criminal Justice/Public Health or Communication focused student intern (s) who is/are ready to apply knowledge of Social Justice; Political Science; Community Development; Environmental Justice; Economics and Social Determinants of Health, in a collaborative multi organizational community focused environment. - Analyze the social and demographic statistics for the Pullman; Roseland; Burnside and Chatham communities of Chicago; identify key stakeholders, including significant community organizations; institutions; churches; businesses; politicians and major community development projects;
- Perform research and analysis on "social determinants of health" in general for the African American community in Chicago, and specifically for the Community Areas that Imani Village seeks to serve (Pullman/Roseland/ Burnside and Chatham), this includes attending designated community meetings, and other similar activities, and from such information make recommendations for improving current Imani Village program and projects and the establishment of others;
- Identify and research Career Development programs throughout Chicago and the South Suburbs, that train individuals in "Green Jobs"; catalog the details required to participate in such programs; with specific focus on opportunities for "returning citizens" and help design a proposed Imani Works! collaboration with such programs.

- Help plan, design and launch a community wide (community which Imani Village seeks
 to serve) communication tool(s) such as (but not necessarily limited to) a digital
 newsletter; community news broadcast, etc., that monthly communicates the work and
 endeavors of Imani Village and Imani Works! and invites community participation;
- Help plan and design a volunteer platform and methodology which enables community
 members and others to participate in the work of Imani Village and Imani Works! and
 make recommendations for improvement;
